## **Rolee-Polee**

The game "Rolee-Polee" is a game format where everyone plays their own ball through out the hole. You can play this game as a low gross, low net or both. Also you could play it in flights with low gross, low net or both. The object of the game is to get your approach shot, no matter the number of strokes, near the pin.

Once your on ball is on the green, is where the fun begins...

If your approach shot to the hole is within the length of the flag pole, you have achieved a "polee". The reward for achieving a "polee" is the same as a "string" in a scramble. It is a "continuation of the previous shot" and your ball is considered holed. Example: If your  $3^{rd}$  shot is on the green and inside the length of the flag pole, your score is 3. (3+0=3, the "polee" is free)

Now, what if your approach shot is outside the length of the flag pole. This means you have achieved a "rolee". A "rolee" is like a mulligan with a twist. It is a **free** shot but you don't use a club, instead you actually kneel down and row you ball towards the hole. Once your ball has stopped rolling you then resume counting strokes until the ball is holed. The object is to roll your ball near the hole leaving yourself "a tap in putt". If by chance your "roll" goes into the hole your ball is considered holed off the pervious stroke.

Example 1: Betty's ball is on the green, on her 3 stroke, but is outside the length of the flag pole. She gets a "rolee", she then kneels down and rolls her ball towards the hole and it stops 2 feet short. She grabs her putter and taps it in. Her score on the hole is 4. (3+1=4, the roll is *free*)

Example 2: Betty's ball is on the green, on her 3 stroke, but is outside the length of the flag pole. She gets a "rolee", she then kneels down and rolls her ball towards the hole and by chance the ball goes into the hole. The roll is free so her score on the hole is 3. (3+0=3, the roll is free)
