

## Nines

Nines is a points-based competition, normally, between players in a group of four, or a **side bet** in any competition where groups of four are playing (in a [four ball](#) or [foursomes](#) match, for example, the players in the match might agree to a side bet using Nines).

Nine points are at stake on each hole, hence the name of the game. The low score on a hole is worth 5 points, the second-lowest 3 points, the next lowest 1 point and the high score 0 points.

The bet can be based on total points - the high-point player is paid by the other three - or can involve point differentials and a per-point value.

Three player adaptation: low ball gets 5 pts, next low ball gets 4 pts, high ball gets 0 pts.

## Net Nines

Nine points are at stake on each hole, hence the name of the game. Net Nine uses dotted cards to determine low net score, The low NET score on a hole is worth 5 points, the second-lowest NET score is worth 3 points, the next lowest NET score is worth 1 point and the high NET score gets 0 points.

In case of a tie on the NET score take the two positions involved and divide the total of the two positions by 2; ex: tie for low net score. Add 5 pts and 3 pts and divide by 2,  $(5+3=8, 8/2= 4$  pts each). 3-way tie add the 3 position points together and divide by 3. 4-way tie each player in the foursome gets 2.25 pts
