

Odds or Evens

Odds and Evens can be played as a game format or a side bet. It is an individual stroke play tournament with $\frac{1}{2}$ handicaps. Once the round is underway the committee or someone not playing in the event will choose which holes to use. The 9 odd numbered holes or the 9 even numbered holes.

At the conclusion of 18 holes the odd or even decision will be announced, and those holes will be totaled. Low gross and low net scores are the winners.

Variation 1: Have half the field play odd holes and the other half play even holes. The winners are the low gross and low net scores with no odd or even consideration. In other words, winners come from the entire field.

Variation 2: Have half the field play odd holes, and the other half play even holes. This time around, consider the players who play the odd holes as a team and the players who play the even holes as the other team. The team HDCP is determined by totaling all the $\frac{1}{2}$ HDCP's. Now combined the scores from the Odd team members and subtract their team HDCP and do the same for the Even team. The winning team is the one with the lowest NET score.
